# What is CCSS?

Columbiana County Senior Services (CCSS) helps Columbiana County residents age 60 and older remain safe in their homes. It provides inhome services for eligible seniors who might otherwise be forced to leave their homes. CCSS expands services that may already be provided by family and friends.



Who operates this program?

CCSS is a division of Columbiana County Jobs and Family Services. The Columbiana County Board of Commissioners has appointed an advisory board to monitor program needs and policies.

# What help is available?

Eligibility for each service is determined by a CCSS case manager during a home visit.

# **Case Management:**

A professional case manager coordinates your services and monitors your care.

#### **Environmental Services:**

Pest control, major house cleaning and waste removal.

## Home Care Assistance:

A trained aide helps with housekeeping, personal care and other daily activities.

## **Guardians/Representative Payee:**

For individuals who are unable to make decisions for themselves or need help managing their Social Security benefits.

## Who is eligible?



Services are available to Columbiana County residents age 60 and older who need assistance to maintain safe independence in their home.

Eligibility for each service is determined by a CCSS case manager during the initial home visit, which is completed at no charge.

## How much will services cost?

There is no income qualification for this program. However, depending on your income, you may be required to help pay for the cost of your care through a co-payment.

Payment is on a sliding scale based on your income and fixed medical and shelter expenses.
